1. Commonwealth Games 2026: Harsh Singh and Asmita Dey Win Historic Judo Gold for India; Marking the Dawn of a New Era for Indian Judo

India achieved a historic milestone in judo at the Glasgow Commonwealth Games 2026, with Harsh Singh (Men's 60kg) and Asmita Dey (Women's 48kg) winning gold medals. These are India's first-ever gold medals in judo at the Commonwealth Games. This achievement showcases the rising standard of Indian judo, the impact of modern training, and India's strong presence in international competition. This success will provide fresh inspiration and a solid foundation for Indian judo ahead of future Olympic and Asian Games.



2. Commonwealth Games 2026: Neeraj Chopra and Yash Veer Singh's historic double podium, India's global lead in athletics strengthened

India achieved a historic double podium in the men's javelin throw event at the Glasgow Commonwealth Games 2026, where Neeraj Chopra won silver with a throw of 85.83m and Yash Veer Singh won bronze with a personal best of 85.41m. Sri Lanka's Rumesh Pathiraj won the gold medal with a record throw of 89.75 metres. This performance took India's total medal tally to 23 and is a symbol of the success of the growing talent, modern training and sports infrastructure in Indian athletics. This achievement further strengthens India's chances in future Olympics, World Championships and Asian Games.



3. Union Cabinet Approves Restructured 'Khelo India' Scheme: ₹36,441 Crore Investment to Give New Dimension to Sports Ecosystem

The Union Cabinet, chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, has approved the restructured Khelo India scheme with an outlay of ₹36,441 crore for the period 2026-27 to 2030-31; this marks the largest government investment in the sports sector in independent India. The scheme aims to provide athletes—ranging from the grassroots to the Olympic level—with modern training, sports science, nutrition, advanced infrastructure, and digital facilities. Aligned with the National Sports Policy 2025, the National Education Policy 2020, and the Fit India Movement, the scheme focuses on promoting a sports culture and providing equal opportunities to rural talent.



4. GST Collection Hits Record ₹2.11 Lakh Crore in July 2026: Signals Robust Economic Activity and Tax Compliance

India's gross GST collection stood at ₹2.11 lakh crore in July 2026, marking a 15.4% increase compared to the previous year, while net GST collection (after refunds) was recorded at ₹1.81 lakh crore. This growth is attributed to rising domestic consumption, increased trade activities, a surge in imports, improved tax compliance, and digital tax administration. Implemented on July 1, 2017, the GST regime unified various indirect taxes to establish a "One Nation, One Tax, One Market" system.



5. Inauguration of 'Alluri Sitarama Raju International Airport' in Andhra Pradesh: A boost for regional connectivity, investment, and economic growth

On August 1, 2026, Prime Minister Narendra Modi inaugurated the Alluri Sitarama Raju International Airport at Bhogapuram, Andhra Pradesh; the airport was constructed by the GMR Group at a cost of approximately ₹5,000 crore. Set to commence operations on August 17, 2026, the airport will have an initial capacity of 6 million (60 lakh) passengers per annum, which will be expanded to 40 million (4 crore) passengers in the future. This project will play a pivotal role in boosting air connectivity, tourism, industry, investment, logistics, and exports in North Andhra Pradesh.



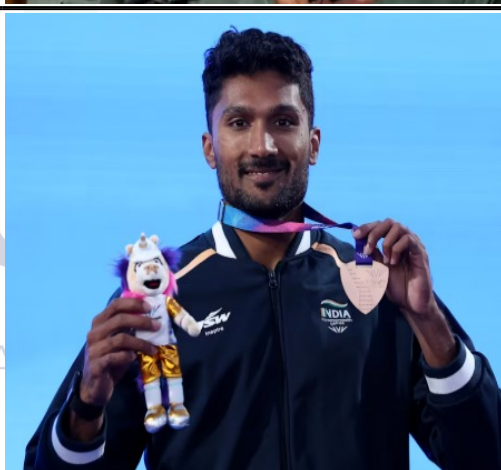
6. IAF Deputy Chief Air Marshal A.K. Bharti Retires: Noted for Strategic Leadership and Joint Military Coordination in Operation 'Sindoor'

On July 31, 2026, Deputy Chief of the Air Staff (DCAS) Air Marshal A.K. Bharti retired following a long and distinguished military career, paying tribute to the martyrs at the National War Memorial. He played a pivotal role in planning, coordinating, and executing air operations as the Director General Air Operations (DGAO) during Operation 'Sindoor'. During the operation, he effectively articulated India's defense strategy and tri-service coordination in joint press briefings alongside senior Army and Navy officials. His service will be remembered for his significant contributions to the modernization of the Indian Air Force, operational capability, and the strengthening of national security.



7. Commonwealth Games 2026: Tejaswin Shankar makes history by winning India's first-ever decathlon medal

At the Glasgow Commonwealth Games 2026, Tejaswin Shankar made history by becoming the first Indian athlete to win a medal in the men's decathlon event, securing the bronze with a score of 7,976 points. Despite a knee injury, he delivered a stellar performance across the 10 events held over two days. The decathlon is one of the toughest multi-event competitions in athletics, testing an athlete's speed, power, endurance, and technical proficiency. With this achievement, Tejaswin Shankar became the first Indian athlete to win Commonwealth Games medals in two different events.



8. U.S. Coast Guard Day: A Symbol of Maritime Security, Law Enforcement, and Humanitarian Services

U.S. Coast Guard Day is observed annually on August 4th to commemorate the establishment of the United States Coast Guard (USCG) in 1790. The force plays a vital role in maritime security, search and rescue, maritime law enforcement, environmental protection, and relief and rescue operations during natural disasters. India and the U.S. are enhancing cooperation in the Indo-Pacific region across areas such as maritime security, maritime domain awareness, joint exercises, and Humanitarian Assistance and Disaster Relief (HADR). This partnership strengthens regional stability while reinforcing a free, secure, and rules-based maritime order.
