1. 65th Subroto Cup 2026 Kicks Off in New Delhi: 108 Teams to Compete Across Three Age Categories

The 65th Subroto Cup International Football Tournament 2026 commenced on August 18, 2026, at the Dr. B.R. Ambedkar Stadium in New Delhi. Air Marshal S. Shivakumar attended the opening ceremony as the chief guest, while weightlifter Lovepreet Singh was present as the guest of honor. A total of 108 teams are participating in the tournament across three age categories: Junior Girls (Under-17), Junior Boys (Under-17), and Sub-Junior Boys (Under-15). In the opening match, Meghalaya defeated Chandigarh in the Junior Girls Under-17 category; the participating teams have been divided into eight groups, with group winners advancing to the knockout stage.



2. From Ross Island to Netaji Subhash Chandra Bose Island: The Historical Significance of Renaming Colonial Sites in Andaman & Nicobar

The historic Ross Island in the Andaman and Nicobar archipelago was renamed Netaji Subhash Chandra Bose Island in December 2018. Netaji Subhash Chandra Bose hoisted the Indian flag in Port Blair on December 30, 1943, giving the island a special connection to the freedom struggle. During British rule, the island served as the headquarters of the British administration in the Andamans, and remnants of colonial-era buildings still exist there today. As part of this same renaming initiative, Havelock Island was renamed Swaraj Dweep, and Neil Island was renamed Shaheed Dweep.



3. Project approved to widen 82.578 km section of NH-22 in Bihar to four lanes: India-Nepal border connectivity to get a boost

Chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, the CCEA has approved a ₹3,590.73 crore project to widen the 82.578 km Muzaffarpur–Sonbarsa section of NH-22 in Bihar to four lanes. The project will be developed under the Hybrid Annuity Model (HAM) and includes the construction of 7 major bridges, 3 railway overbridges, and two flyovers. A 340-meter-long bridge will be built over the Bagmati River, and the road is designed for a speed of 100 kmph. This project will strengthen the PM GatiShakti National Master Plan by enhancing connectivity to the India-Nepal border, industries, railway stations, agricultural logistics hubs, and the Bhitamre Land Port.



4. 31st Southern Zonal Council Meeting in Mahabalipuram: Focus on Cooperative Federalism and Inter-State Coordination

The 31st meeting of the Southern Zonal Council will be held on August 20, 2026, in Mahabalipuram, Tamil Nadu, under the chairmanship of Union Home and Cooperation Minister Amit Shah. Representatives from Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka, Kerala, Tamil Nadu, Telangana, as well as Puducherry, Andaman & Nicobar Islands, and Lakshadweep, will participate in this meeting. Zonal Councils were constituted under the States Reorganisation Act, 1956, and there are a total of five such councils in India. These councils strengthen the concepts of cooperative federalism and "Team India" by fostering Centre-State and inter-state coordination.



5. FAO-WFP Hunger Hotspots Report 2026: Risk of Severe Food Insecurity in 13 Countries and Territories

According to the joint FAO-WFP Hunger Hotspots Report 2026, there is a high risk of severe food insecurity and starvation in 13 countries and territories between June and November 2026. Sudan, South Sudan, Yemen, Palestine, northeastern Nigeria, and Somalia have been identified as the most concerning hunger hotspots. Afghanistan, the Democratic Republic of the Congo, Haiti, Myanmar, Mali, Lebanon, and Madagascar are also among the regions facing severe food crises. Conflict, climate change, displacement, economic instability, rising food prices, and limited humanitarian aid are the primary drivers of global food insecurity.



6. Trump Cites India's Electoral System as Example: Debate Intensifies in the US over SAVE America Act and Voter ID

US President Donald Trump cited India's electoral system—and the participation of 646 million (64.6 crore) voters—as an example while advocating for voter identification and stricter registration rules. The SAVE America Act is a proposed bill aimed at tightening citizenship and identity verification requirements for US federal elections. In India, the EPIC system and electoral rolls are used for voter identification, managed by the Election Commission of India. The electoral systems of India and the US differ; notably, postal voting in India is available only to specific categories of eligible voters.



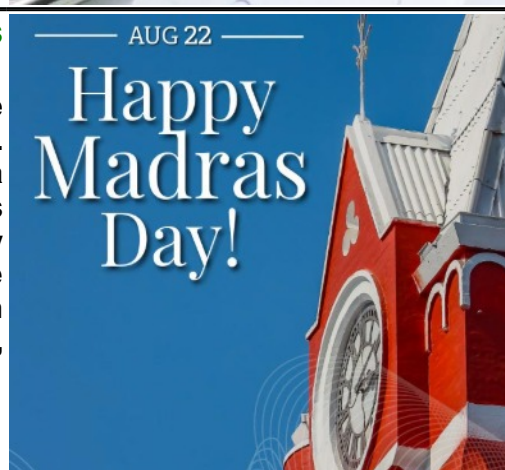
7. FPI vs. FDI: Two Major Channels of Foreign Investment in India and Their Impact on the Economy

In Foreign Portfolio Investment (FPI), foreign investors invest in Indian shares, bonds, and other financial securities, whereas Foreign Direct Investment (FDI) relates to long-term investments in businesses and projects. FPI is relatively more liquid and volatile, with its flows influenced by global economic conditions and investor sentiment. While FPI enhances liquidity in Indian capital markets, large-scale outflows can exert pressure on the stock market and the rupee. FDI contributes significantly to capital formation, employment, manufacturing, technology transfer, and long-term economic growth.



8. Madras Day: Commemorating the founding of Chennai, its colonial history, and its evolution into a modern metropolis

Madras Day is celebrated annually on August 22nd to commemorate the founding of the present-day city of Chennai and its historical evolution. On August 22, 1639, Francis Day, a representative of the British East India Company, acquired a tract of land from local rulers; Fort St. George was subsequently established there. Fort St. George became a key administrative and commercial hub for British rule in South India and the Madras Presidency. The city was renamed from Madras to Chennai in 1996; today, it serves as the capital of Tamil Nadu and a major industrial, port, and cultural center in India.

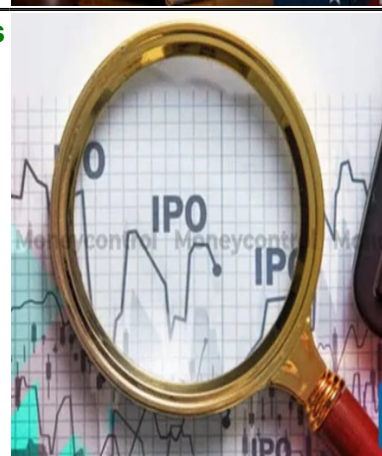

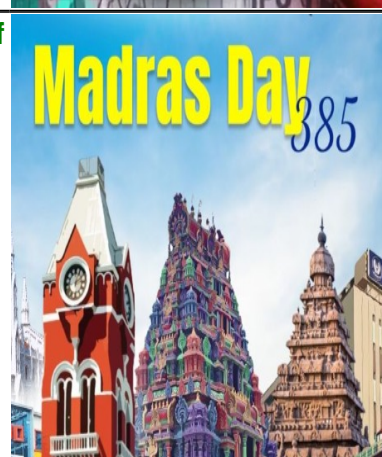
